As a first-generation, low-income student from Memphis, TN, I entered Stanford with a goal to explore and better understand the intersectionality of my identity as a Vietnamese American woman. The Stanford API community has given me the opportunity to make an impact through personal leadership development and has sparked my passion for Southeast Asian American community advocacy. In addition to staffing at the A3C for all 4 years, I served as co-chair of both the Stanford Vietnamese Student Association (SVSA) and Mua Lac Hong (MLH), volunteered as a Vietnamese Interpreter in East San Jose, organized workshops at the Listen to the Silence (LTS) Conference, and helped start the 22 Percent Campaign.

I'm beyond grateful for my life changing mentors: Cindy, Jerald, and Latana as I begin my next chapter pursuing my Master's in Public Health (MPH) at the Emory Rollins School of Public Health with a concentration in Behavioral, Social, and Health Education Sciences (BSHES). I will highlight underrepresented narratives to combat these social inequities that disproportionately affect communities of color as exacerbated by COVID-19. I'm committed to pursuing an engaging and meaningful career to address health disparities and advocate for community empowerment as a future public health professional working with marginalized immigrant and refugee communities.
